Presentation options and instructions:

1. Google Slideshow:

Create a slideshow about your state on Google Slides. There must be a minimum of 10 slides. Try NOT to type a lot of words on each slide. Instead, write what you want to say about each slide on notecards to present your state.

2. Brochure:

Create a tri-fold brochure either by hand or on the computer, that provides information about your state. The brochure should be colorful, and easy to read.

3. Tri-board Display:

Create a colorful visual tri-board that attractively displays important information about your state.

4. TV commercial:

Create a 1-2 minute TV commercial about your state. Persuade your audience that they need to come visit or vacation in your state.
